

47 & 48 Present perfect

Use

Present perfect is used to talk about actions which have or haven't happened and which have a connection with the present.

- *I've already eaten thank you, I'm really not hungry.*
- *Are you going to Disneyland? We've been there, we had a great time.*

Present perfect is also used to describe the state of things from a time in the past until the present

- *House prices have risen by 15% this year.*
- *I've lived in the same flat for 12 years.*

Form

(+) subject + have/has + past participle (3rd form)

(-) subject + have/has + not + past participle

(?) (question word) + have/has + subject + past participle
